

In *Suspicion* (Duke University Press), Charles reframes Afro-Barbadian vaccine refusal around the human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine from a question of hesitancy to one of suspicion. Drawing on ethnographic fieldwork, black feminist theory, transnational feminist studies and science and technology studies, Charles foregrounds Afro-Barbadians' gut feelings and emotions and the lingering trauma of colonial and biopolitical violence while offering new entry points into discussions on racialized biopolitics, neocolonialism, care, affect, and biomedicine across the Black diaspora.

Dr. Nicole Charles is an Assistant Professor of Women and Gender Studies, Feminist Studies in Culture and Media in the Department of Historical Studies at the University of Toronto Mississauga, with a graduate appointment in the Women and Gender Studies Institute at the University of Toronto.

Dr. Deborah Thomas is the R. Jean Brownlee Professor of Anthropology in the Department of Anthropology at the University of Pennsylvania.

Dr. Vanessa Agard-Jones is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Anthropology at Columbia University in the City of New York.
