The course communicates the growing field of "girl studies" and provides a critical exploration of the historical, social, psychological and political definitions attached to girlhood. We will move toward a feminist understanding of how definitions of girl-child shape individual experience, historical narratives, cultural representations, political agendas and futures.

Candidates will have a completed, or nearly completed, Ph.D. with a scholarly background in women and gender studies.

Preferred Qualifications:

Teaching experience of or within a similar course at the university level would be preferred; expertise in Black and intersectional feminisms is an asset for this position.

Relevant Criterion:

The need to acquire experience is the more relevant criterion than past teaching experience in respect of this posted position.

- Developing, marking and administering course assignments, tests & exams
